15. <u>ADOPTION OF THE SAN ELIJO JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 BUDGET, INVESTEMENT POLICY, AND APPOINTMENT OF TREASURER</u>

General Manager, Michael Thornton, presented the proposed Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget for adoption by the Board of Directors. He noted that SEJPA has not received any public comments or requested changes to the budget. However, staff identified minor clerical errors that have been corrected.

General Manager Thronton highlighted that the FY 2024-25 Recommended Budget consists of \$10,521,442 operating expense, \$3,666,000 capital appropriation, and \$2,373,604 debt service payments for a total budget of \$16,561,046, which is anticipated to be adequate to fulfill the mission of SEJPA.

The General Manager recommended the re-appointment of Christopher Trees, Director of Operations, as SEJPA Treasurer for FY 2024-25.

16. <u>PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT MEMBRANE MODULES FOR THE ADVANCED</u> WATER PURIFICATION SYSTEM

General Manager, Michael Thornton, presented that in 2012, SEJPA constructed an advanced water purification (AWP) system at the San Elijo Water Campus to enhance water quality and increase recycled water production. The AWP system uses microfiltration followed by reverse osmosis, with design capacities of 1.3 million gallons per day (mgd) and 0.5 mgd, respectively. Microfiltration is performed by two PALL Corporation AP-6 skids with Microza Hollow fiber membrane racks, each containing 60 modules, totaling 120 modules.

The industry life cycle for these modules is approximately 10 years. Despite being in service for 12 years and performing beyond expectations, recent evaluations indicate the modules are nearing the end of their life cycle.

To ensure compatibility with existing equipment skids, SEJPA requested a proposal from Aria Filtra under a sole-source procurement, as allowed by SEJPA Purchasing Policy. The proposed price of \$2,700 per module was validated as competitive against other recent publicly-bid contracts.

Moved by Board Member Zito and seconded by Board Chair Hinze to:

1. Authorize the General Manager to execute Purchase Order with Aira Filtra in an amount not-to-exceed \$381,667.49 for membrane modules, ancillary parts, and installation supervision.

17. CAPITAL PROGRAM UPDATE

Director of Infrastructure and Sustainability, Tom Falk, reviewed SEJPA's 3-year capital plan delivery schedule and cost summary. He also reviewed the status of ongoing projects, provided a 3-month lookahead for the upcoming quarter, and explained how staff are working to monitor and mitigate capital program risks.

No action required. This item was submitted for information only.

19. AWARD OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR FACILITY PLAN UPDATE

Director of Infrastructure and Sustainability, Tom Falk, presented that SEJPA completed the last Facility Plan in 2015, outlining a phased capital improvement program. It is industry best practice for a public agency to update foundational planning documents to align infrastructure investments and operational strategies.

Director Falk stated that as SEJPA enters the fourth and final phase of the ongoing capital program, it is time to update the Facility Plan to identify, prioritize, and plan for the next generation of capital projects. The focus for the Facility Plan update will be Asset Management, Capital Projects and Capital Improvement programming.

SEJPA advertised a request for proposals (RFP) through its online procurement portal, PlanetBids. SEJPA received four proposals by the due date of April 11, 2024 from (alphabetically): Black & Veatch Corporation (B&V), Carollo Engineers, Inc. (Carollo), Hazen and Sawyer, and Hoch Consulting APC. SEJPA staff reviewed the proposals and rated the teams in accordance with the selection process defined in the RFP.

Staff met with the highest ranked team, B&V, to review scope assumptions, clarify project objectives, and confirm expectations for project delivery. Staff also reviewed the proposed level of effort (labor hours) and compared billing rates against typical market rates, determining that the scope, level of effort, and fee are reasonable. Based on the outcome of scope and fee negotiations, Staff recommends award of the Facility Plan Update to B&V for a not-to-exceed fee of \$416,600, which is within the amount budgeted for this capital project.

RECOMMENDATION

No action required. This memorandum is submitted for information only.

DISCUSSION

Monthly Treatment Facility Performance and Evaluation

Wastewater treatment for the San Elijo Joint Powers Authority (SEJPA) met all National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) ocean effluent limitation requirements for the month of May 2024. The primary indicators of treatment performance include the removal of Total Suspended Solids (TSS) and Carbonaceous Biochemical Oxygen Demand (CBOD). The SEJPA is required to remove a minimum of 85 percent of the TSS and CBOD from the wastewater. Treatment levels for TSS and CBOD were 98.6 and 98.7 percent removal, respectively, during the month of May.

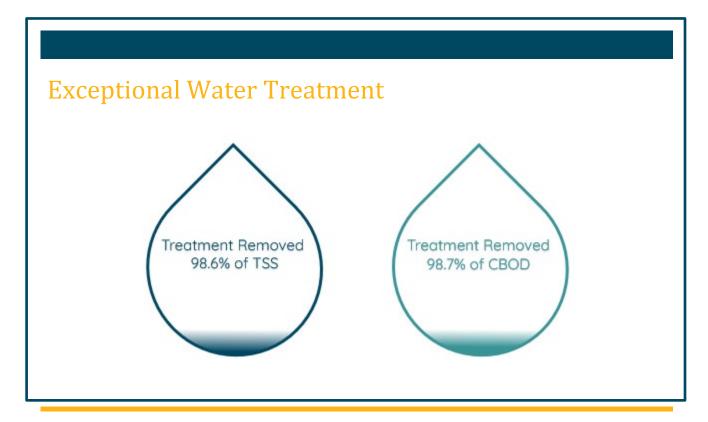
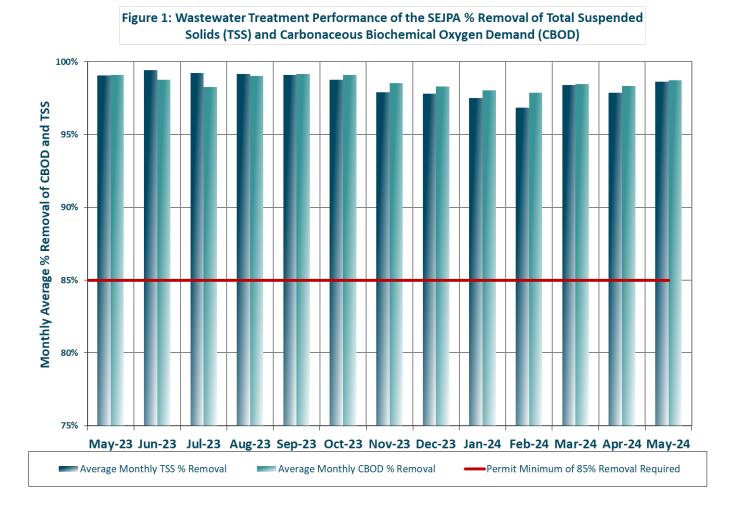
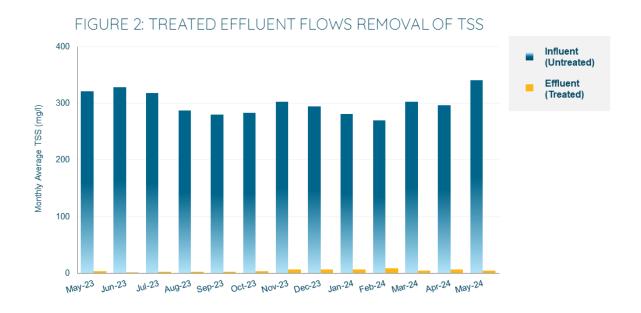
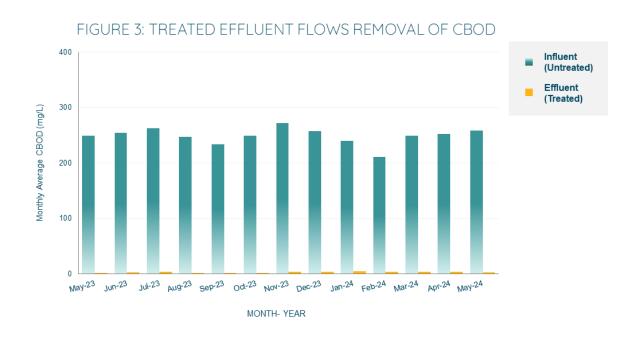


Figure 1 (below) shows historic treatment performance trends for the removal of TSS and CBOD over the last 13 months compared to the permit minimum removal requirement of 85%.



Figures 2 and 3 (below) show historic influent vs effluent TSS and CBOD concentration fluctuations in the strength of the wastewater being received and discharged by the SEJPA.





Member Agency Flows

Table 1 (below) presents the influent and effluent flows for the month of May. Average daily influent flows were recorded for each contributing agency. In May, about 48% of the incoming flow was repurposed as recycled water with the remaining flow discharged to the ocean.

DISCUSSION

Recycled Water Production

For the month of May 2024, recycled water demand was 182.9 acre-feet (AF), which was met using 179.2 AF of recycled water and 3.7 AF of supplemental water. May demand met budget expectations of 182 AF.

For the first eleven months of FY 2023-24, total recycled water production was 1,353 AF, which is below budget by 7.7%.

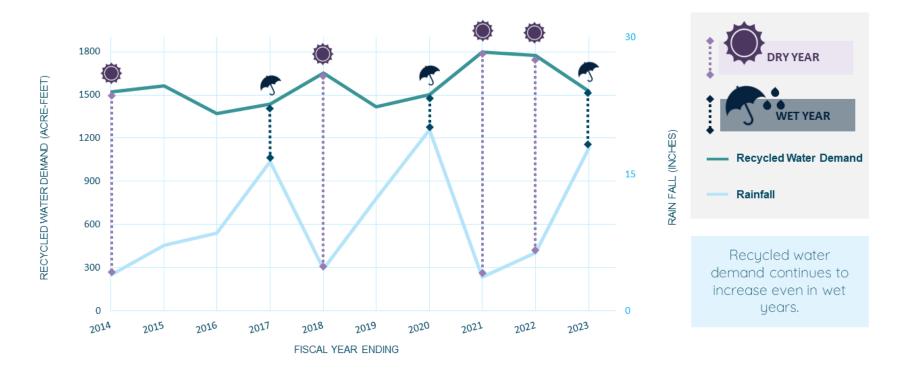
Figure 1 (attached) provides a graphical view of annual recycled water demand spanning the last 10 fiscal years, with the overlay of annual rainfall. Since the recycled water program primarily serves outdoor irrigation, annual demand is reduced during wet periods and increases during times of drought. Figure 2 (attached) shows the monthly recycled water demand for each May for the last ten years to provide a year-over-year comparison. Figure 3 (attached) compares budget versus actual recycled water sales for FY 2023-24.

FIGURE 1: RECYCLED WATER DEMAND AND RAINFALL COMPARISON



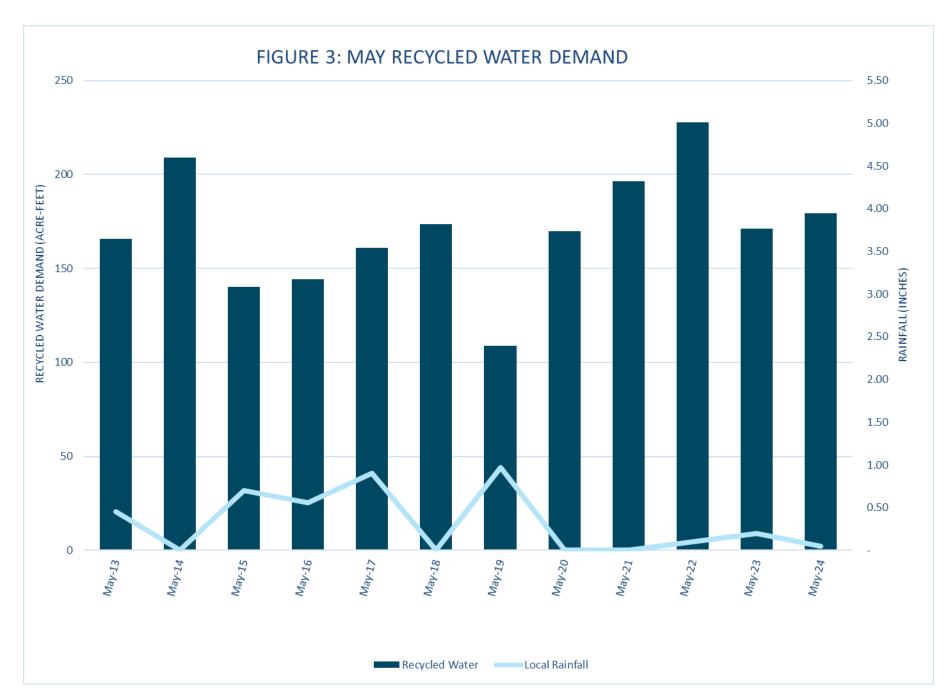
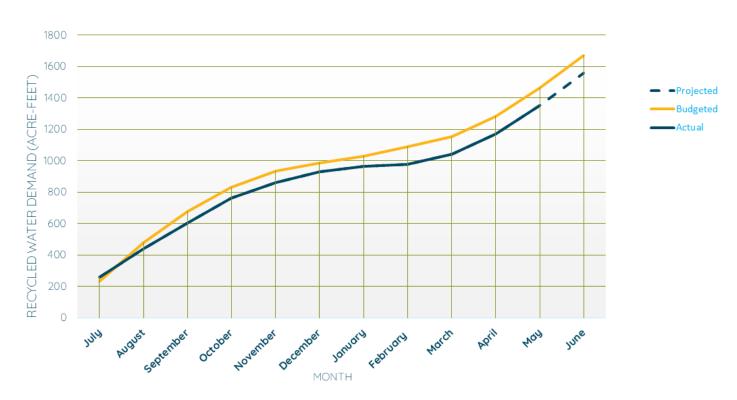


FIGURE 3: FY2023/24 CUMULATIVE DEMAND VS BUDGET

SUBJECT: AWARD CONSTRUCTION PHASE CONTRACTS FOR THE WANKET TANK

REFURBISHMENT PROJECT

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Directors:

- 1. Authorize the General Manager to award and execute a contract for the construction of the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project to Filanc Construction in the lump sum amount of \$2,407,600; and
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to ratify prior amendments totaling \$47,783 and execute Amendment 4 to the professional services agreement with Ardurra for engineering services during construction for the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project in an amount not to exceed \$59,782;
- 3. Discuss and take action as appropriate.

BACKGROUND

In 2022, the San Elijo Joint Powers Authority (SEJPA) acquired a one-third ownership interest in the 3-million-gallon Wanket Tank located adjacent to the Encinitas Ranch Golf Course. This potable water storage tank has been out of service for over a decade due to decreased storage needs resulting from water conservation efforts.

SEJPA has developed engineering plans to refurbish the concrete tank and convert it for recycled water storage, along with constructing a connecting pipeline to SEJPA's existing recycled water system. Enhancing recycled water storage within the distribution system will reduce system stress during peak demand periods, improve service reliability, and increase service capacity. Additionally, during winter storms the Wanket tank will provide needed storage to reduce hydraulic stress to the outfall system.

SEJPA has secured State and Federal grants totaling up to \$2 million to partially fund the tank refurbishment and pipeline construction.

The Wanket Tank Project comprises two major components: 1) the connecting pipeline and 2) the tank refurbishment. These were initially bundled with an asset management project to replace aging distribution system valves. The combined project was originally budgeted at \$3.51 million and revised to \$3.7 million in September 2023 due to construction inflation. However, the combined strategy did not attract the expected bidder interest and competitive pricing. SEJPA received only one bid, which was nearly \$1.4 million higher than anticipated, leading to its rejection in October 2023. To encourage more participation, SEJPA separated the pipeline and tank refurbishment components and deferred the valve replacements.

In November 2023, SEJPA received three competitive bids for the pipeline component, awarding the contract to Ahrens Mechanical for \$1,176,500, with construction scheduled to commence later this year. The tank refurbishment underwent a value-engineering process to refine its scope and reduce construction risks and was re-bid in Spring 2024.

DISCUSSION

The request for bids (RFB) for the Wanket Recycled Water Pipeline was posted on SEJPA's online procurement portal, PlanetBids, on May 1, 2024, and publicly advertised in Coast News on May 10, 2024, and May 17, 2024. A pre-bid meeting was held on May 16, 2024, followed by a site visit on May 21, 2024. A total of 38 entities accessed the bidding documents via PlanetBids, including 13 contractors registered as "prime" bidders. On June 13, 2024, SEJPA received three bids for the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project, as shown in Table 1. The bids were evaluated for compliance with the advertised requirements, the contractor's ability to perform the work, and the submitted bid price.

Based on SEJPA's evaluation, staff recommends awarding the project to Filanc, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

Additionally, SEJPA will require support from the engineer of record (Ardurra) during construction. Their scope of work includes material and equipment submittal reviews, responding to RFIs related to design questions, resolving design conflicts, attending construction meetings, and issuing final record drawings. Staff recommends a contract amendment to the current Ardurra professional services agreement for these tasks, not to exceed \$59,782. Previous amendments totaling \$47,783 provided additional surveying work, prepared easement documents, repackaged and re-bid the pipeline and tank refurbishment elements, and supported the pipeline construction contract. The total value of the original Ardurra agreement and all amendments to date for both the pipeline and tank elements is \$356,775, approximately 8% of the construction value.

SEJPA retained CDM Smith in September 2023 to provide construction management and inspection services for the Wanket pipeline and tank refurbishment.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The lowest responsive construction bid for the project, received from Filanc, is \$2,407,600. Including soft costs for engineering, design, bidding support, construction management, inspection, and contingency, the total anticipated cost for the tank refurbishment project is \$3.05 million, as shown in Table 2. SEJPA previously committed \$1.55 million to the pipeline project, including soft costs. Committing \$3.05 million to the tank refurbishment element results in a total combined project cost of \$4.6 million, approximately \$1 million greater than earlier capital budget estimates.

The Wanket Tank Refurbishment and connecting Wanket Recycled Water Pipeline are SEJPA's highest priority recycled water projects. They are expected to receive Proposition 1 Grant funding of \$0.62 million and \$0.265 million, respectively. The combined project is also eligible for up to 25% reimbursement through the Bureau of Reclamation Title XVI Water Infrastructure for the Nation (WIIN) program, estimated to be just over \$1 million. The remaining budget (approximately \$2.57 million) will come from the \$10 million recycled water loan secured in May 2023.

With the rising construction costs, SEJPA will be evaluating capital program budgets. Priorities across the agency will be reviewed in the forthcoming Facility Plan Update, and project funding strategies will be validated through the forthcoming Recycled Water Cost of Service Update.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Authorize the General Manager to award and execute a contract for the construction of the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project to J.R. Filanc Construction Company, Inc., in the amount of \$2,407,600.
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to ratify prior amendments totaling \$47,783 and execute Amendment 4 to the professional services agreement with Ardurra for engineering services during construction for the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project in an amount not to exceed \$59,782.
- 3. Discuss and take action as appropriate.

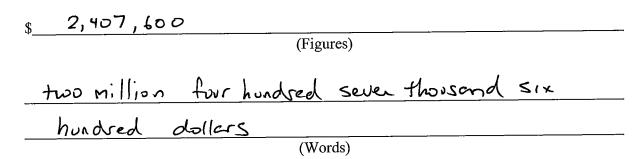

The San Elijo Joint Powers Authority (SEJPA) has requested that Ardurra (formerly IEC) prepare a contract amendment to include engineering support during construction for the Wanket Tank Project to the current services for the Wanket Tank Refurbishment Project (Project). We are pleased to present this detailed scope of work, followed with a detailed fee table showing a breakdown of hours and direct costs.

TASK 1 – Engineering Support During Construction

- Provide as-needed engineering support during construction in response to specific SEJPA request:
 - attendance at the Pre-construction meeting;
 - o attendance at progress meetings, as required;
 - review and response to contractor submittals and shop drawings (assumed to be up to 15 submittals);
 - o review and response to contractor RFI's (assumed to be up to 10 RFIs);
 - o design revisions (assumed to be up to 2)
 - o and, prepare record drawings based upon Contractor's redlines of the Contract Drawings.
- Attend site visits during water tightness testing and perform visual observations of tank exterior during water tightness testing.

The level of effort for these services will be defined by the assigned budget. More comprehensive services, such as additional technical support, construction management, assistance with storm water issues, administration, and inspection services are not included, unless specifically stated herein, but can be added upon mutual written agreement.

TASK 2 – OPTIONAL Engineering Support During Construction

• Perform dive inspection of the tank interior if the tank water tightness testing is unsuccessful. The purpose of the dive inspection would be to evaluate the performance of rehabilitation repairs and determine what additional rehabilitation measures may be necessary to eliminate tank



exfiltration. Provide dive inspection report and review memo to document proposed remedies for tank exfiltration.

FEE

Thank you for the opportunity to provide structural engineering services, during the construction phase, for the proposed refurbishments of San Elijo JPA's Wanket Tank in Encinitas, California. Based on previous conversations, Peterson Structural Engineers, Inc. (PSE) understands that you require us to provide construction support services, including submittal review, responses to RFIs, and structural observation site visits and their associated reports.

The following scope and fee outlines our construction support effort based on our updated drawings and specifications, including the watertightness testing.

Proposed Project Scope

PSE proposes the following scope of work:

1. Construction Phase Support

- a. Respond to up to two (2) construction phase RFI's and/or clarifications, related to the structural scope of work.
- b. Review up to two (2) change order requests, related to the structural scope of work.
- c. Conduct up to two (2) submittals reviews, related to the structural scope of work.
- d. Attend up to three (3) on-site meetings OR structural observations during the construction phase. We have assumed the visits might occur as follow:
 - i. (1) site visits to observe the implementation of the internal repairs,
 - ii. (2) site visits to observe the implementation of the external repairs/patches, safety features, and coring in the roof.
- e. PSE understands that Ardurra, at the request of SEJPA, would like us to include time for supporting responses and associated field visits in the event that the Wanket tank does not pass the watertightness test specified in the contract documents. PSE has assumed the following:
 - i. PSE will provide up to 16 hours of support for this scenario. Support includes meetings (virtual format), review of dive reports/video, and review of product submittals

associated with repairs. PSE will provide responses to the findings from the dive inspection and offer recommendations to address the leakage. PSE cannot guarantee the Wanket tank will be able to comply with the watertightness requirements in the project specifications (AWWA D110) but will make every effort to assist and guide the team to the best value solution. Since the Wanket tank has been offline for approximately 20-years, it is difficult to know what may happen when the tank is initially filled and tested. A plan to fill the tank during the day while personnel are on-site actively observing the tank, and at a rate of 4 to 6 ft a day is advisable. If in-person meetings are anticipated, please let us know so we may update our scope and fee.

- ii. PSE will provide up to 12 hours of field support for this event, including two site visits, one during the initial watertightness test, and a second when the dive team is on site.
 - 1. It is understood that Ardurra is responsible for hiring the dive company.
- f. Generate Record Drawings based on redline markups of construction drawings maintained by the Contractor.

Items specifically excluded from this proposal include rehabilitation or modification to any piping, appurtenances not specifically noted in our June 15, 2022, Scope and Fee letter, such as vent, etc., site civil, architectural (including egress, clearances, waterproofing and flashing), and mechanical/electrical/plumbing element design and coordination. PSE also excludes hiring a dive company in the event that the Wanket tank does not pass the watertightness test.

<u>Proposed Fee and Schedule</u>

Based upon the updated scope of work above, we have generated a fee estimate of \$15,961 (Labor) and project expenses of \$275 (includes 10% markup). The updated total fee estimate, including expenses, is \$16,236.

Project expenses will be billed at cost plus 10%, which have been included above. Invoices will be submitted at the end of the month for structural services performed. Should revisions to this scope and fee proposal be affected by pending information or scope changes, we will apprise you of that situation before proceeding.

Please note that the fee stated above is based solely on an estimate of the time to be expended to complete the scope items defined above. Changes or additions to the defined scope could result in additional fees. PSE will require an amended PO or alternate client official notification before beginning work on design changes or modifications.

The above proposal has been generated assuming that the structural engineering services are to be initiated within a six-month period from the proposal date and substantially completed within twelve months of the proposal date. If the schedule of work exceeds the projected time, we reserve the right to revise our fee estimate accordingly.

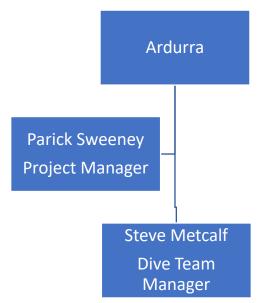

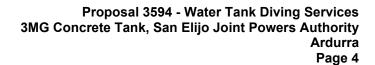

Scope of Services



Tank Dive Assessment - It is understood that the goal of this task is to complete tank assessment to determine its condition and if there are any active leak. The survey of both the internal and external surfaces of the reservoir will be completed. The survey can be completed with the tanks in operation. Our proposal assumes that tank has satisfactory access roads and that access to a tank exterior roof can be made from existing ladders. Underwater surveys would be performed while a tank is full of water using special underwater techniques and AWWA C652 sanitary procedures for potable tanks. The survey will





be conducted by a team of highly trained and certified inspectors having exceptional diving and underwater photography skills. During the evaluations, particular attention will be paid to the condition of the following critical areas:

Roof
Roof Structure
Shell
Tank Bottom
Overflow Pipe/Weir
Drains/Sumps
Inlets/Outlets

Piping Vents/Screens Shell and Roof Chine/Joints Weld or Bolt Connections Ladders/Safety Climbs Vandal Deterrents Platforms/Railings Manways

Ringwall/Anchor Bolts

CP Equipment/Components

The focus of the inspections will be to evaluate the current condition of the interior and exterior surfaces with a focus on any coating systems and the level of deterioration on a tank. The evaluation will involve visual observations, but will also include applicable measurements dry film thickness (DFT) measurements, adhesion testing, steel ultrasonic thickness (UT) testing, pit measurements etc., where applicable.

Visual exterior observations will note the degree of exterior paint chalking and any breaks, blisters, or other coating defects. It is not the intent of this exterior evaluation work to make access to any surfaces that cannot be surveyed from the tank ladder(s) or catwalks (i.e. repelling is not included within this scope). The degree of chalking will be determined in general accordance with ASTM D4214 "Standard Test Method for Evaluating the Degree of Chalking of Exterior Paint Films" and areas of rusting will be quantified in accordance with ASTM D610 "Standard Test Method for Evaluating the Degree of Rusting of Painted Steel Surfaces." Dry

film thickness (DFT) measurements will be obtained in general accordance with SSPC: The Society of Protective Coatings Paint Application Specification No. 2 "Measurement of Dry Film Thickness with Magnetic Gages" and exterior paint adhesion will be assessed using ASTM D3359 "Standard Test Method for Evaluating Adhesion by Tape Test, Method A" (modified) and/or ASTM D6677 "Adhesion by Knife Test". Any blistering will be quantified in accordance with ASTM D714 "Standard Test Method for Evaluating the Degree of Blistering Paints."



For the concrete tank, the surveys will investigate any area where rust or other corrosion products are in evidence from reinforcing steel. Concrete will also be evaluated for excessive efflorescence, erosion, cracking, spalling, etc. Any indications of leakage will be determined.

Any aluminum substrates, such as dome roofs will be evaluated for corrosion or chemical attack (High chlorine vapors). Unique items on bolted tanks that can result in maintenance concerns, such as fastener channels or stave plate gaskets will be a focus of the inspections.

Assessment Report - The product of the above would be a written narrative and color pictorial description of the condition of the tank along with specific recommendations for coatings, cathodic protection, and structural considerations, where applicable. Recommendations for



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maintenance work will be based on the level of corrosion and the condition of tank coatings and CP systems. Assessments will be based on the amount of change from the original tank design. The life expectancy of existing coating systems, as well as the projected corrosion rates on the structure is used to determine the future maintenance strategies. Recommendations for coatings work will be based on paint or lining's percentage of failure, ability to be recoated, suspected film heavy metal content, estimated remaining life of the system(s); and/or concerns with any impressed current cathodic protection system.

It should be clear that our cost proposal does not include a seismic analysis of a tank's ability to structurally withstand a probable seismic event, nor does this scope include any geotechnical/soils reports. The report will also include estimated repair costs (if applicable) and prioritization for recommended work. A narrated video will also be included for the underwater inspection.

Underwater Lining Spot Repair - We are also proposing to complete spot patches on the accessible immersed areas of the tank interior that are suspected of leaking. Any locations found to be leaking will be spot patched with an NSF61 certified underwater curing epoxy. CSI has had great success patching leaks, but these patches will be applied on a best-effort basis. Our cost-proposal assumes that this type of repair will be required on a few locations that can be patched within a couple of hours.
